Judaism itself, all have spiritual concepts and values. Some objections to traditional Judaism were analysed in detail. The first concerned the Five Books of Moses which were stated to contain a religion of material values, but in reality its contents dealt with spiritual matters.

A second objection was directed against the customs of Judaism, criticism being particularly levelled against the Dietary Laws. Briefly, the statement made against them was this: "How can the things we eat affect us spiritually?" The lecturer believes that if Jews are conscious of a distinction between clean and unclean animals, then they must also be conscious of a distinction between what is pure and impure in life generally.

A third objection was that raised by the Reform Movement, which accused traditional Judaism of being unspiritual. But Chassidim easily brought out the fallacy of this accusation. In an account of the teachings of this Movement, Rev. Levine showed that there is nothing in Chassidism that differs from Judaism, except that the former stressed the spiritual side more strongly than it had been before.

After the interval, the discussion aroused keen interest in the audience, and amongst those who participated were Messrs. S. M. Levin, S. Sacks, Herman and E. Charloff. A piano and vocal solos by Miss Kassel and Mr. H. Rabinowitz respectively, were also very much appreciated by the audience.
