Mr. B. Chideckel said that under the direction of the Board of Jewish Education the Hebrew School had made remarkable progress during the past few years. The teachers at the Talmud Torah were all imbued with a love for Jewish tradition, Jewish ethics and the Jewish people. Three partners were responsible for the success of a Hebrew school—the teachers, the children and the community. The teachers were doing their duty scientifically and thoroughly, the children were doing their work diligently. The Jewish community of Cape Town had also to do its duty fully. The children were the main point in the security of the Jewish existence and at the Hebrew School they gained that knowledge that made them good Jews and Jewesses.
