Mischa Elman's Skill.

The great artistry of Mischa Elman who will be heard in recitals in Cape Town on Saturday the 26th June and Tuesday the 29th June, has brought to the front many great compositions which had long lain neglected until he introduced them in his programmes.

The most noteworthy case of this kind is the Tschaiakowsky violin concerto, which was ignored by virtuosi until Elman, with characteristic courage, made it celebrated.

After his beautiful interpretation in Germany, the demand for it became so great that during the following year the artist

was requested to play it twenty-five times with leading orchestras.

Mischa Elman has selected a varied programme for his first concert on Saturday the 26th June, and this will include the magnificent Kreutzer Sonata by Beethoven. Another work that calls for demonstration of impeccable virtuosity is Handel's Sonata in E Major which will present an interesting contrast to Beethoven.

Elman's accompanist will be Vladimir Padwa, himself a musician of no mean accomplishments. It is essential that the accompanist for the Kreutzer Sonata be of outstanding ability, because this great composition is tremendous in conception both for the violinist and his accompanist.
