WEBB SCHOLARSHIP AWARD.

Gained by Mr. H. Schauder.

Notification has been received from the University of South Africa that Mr. H. Schauder (son of Mr. and Mrs. A. Schauder, of Port Elizabeth) has passed the M.A. (Economics) examination in the first-class, and that he has been awarded a Webb Research Scholarship of the value of £200 per annum for further work.
