



## The Nelson Sisters MUSICAL SOCIETY'S CONCERT

A N interesting item on the programme of the recital given by the famous Nelson trio on Monday evening (under the aus-pices of the Johannesburg Musical Society) was the inclusion of a "Prayer," by Ernst Bloch, the modernistic composer, from his series of "Sketches of Jewish Life."

It is the first time, I believe, that we have had a composition of Bloch played at a Johannesburg concert and Zara Nelson, the 'cellist of the trio, gave an exquisite rendering of the beautiful work. The pro-gramme of Beethoven and Brahms items for piano, violin, and 'cello were delightfully rendered in a manner which gave great pleasure to a discerning audience. The playing by the Nelson sisters is rich in tonal quality; there is so fine an underlying spirit of rhythm and harmony between them. Their execution of the most difficult music leaves little room for im-
