

The Herzl Yahrzeit

The thirty-first anniversary of Theodor Herzl's death will be commemorated in Johannesburg by the holding of a public meeting at the H.O.D. Hall on Sunday, July 21, at 8.15 p.m. The meeting is being organised by the Transvaal Zionist Youth Executive with the co-operation of Zionist bodies in the city.

Dr. D. Katzen will speak in English and Mr. Z. Hareven, of Germiston, in Yiddish, while Dr. Birnbaum will deliver a Hebrew address. Cantor Berele Chagy will intone the "Haskarah" and the chair will be taken by Mr. D. Dunsky.

Johannesburg Jewry is urged to attend the gathering in large numbers, as befits the occasion and the significance of Herzl's inspiration and leadership.

THE symphony concerts of the African Broadcasting Company's Orchestra are becoming a brilliant feature of the present musical revival in Johannesburg.

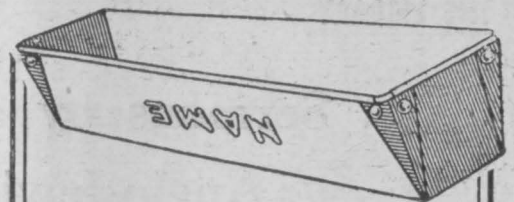
