AMERICAN PALESTINE LEGIONAIRES

Ready to Join Again

New York, July 1st.

A MASS meeting of the American Palnight, adopted a resolution to send a memorandum to the Colonial Office declaring their willingness to serve the Palestine Government, in order once and for all to end the destruction of life and property and to restore peace in the country.

GERMAN ZIONISTS AND THE YISHUB

Active Steps Towards Assistance

Berlin, July 1st.

THE present disturbances in Palestine have increased the desire of German Jewry to take part in the upbuilding of the Jewish National Home. At various representative conferences of German Jewry which passed resolutions firmly supporting the Yishub, two more decisions were taken whose implication is believed to be not so much material as moral. The presidium of the Keren Hayesod has sent a request to all contributors to add a further 25 per cent. of their regular contributions for a special fund for immigration and upbuilding. The appeal was made because of the necessity for increasing the power of national capital. Further, the Board of the Zionist Federation of Germany has decided that all organised Zionists are in duty bound to allocate part of their daily earnings for the two national funds under the title Bizur Haaretz.

OUTRAGE IN WESTERN GALICIA

Warsaw, June 29th.

ONE of the most brazen anti-Jewish outrages reported in this country occurred in the little town of Myszlenice, in Western Galicia, about twenty miles from Cracow, early yesterday morning.

A band of about 150 hooligans invaded the sleeping town shortly after four o'clock in the morning, cut the telephone lines linking the town with the world outside and disarmed the local police detachment.

The band then broke into the home of the District Commissioner and completely demolished the furniture. Turning their attention to the Jewish shops, the hooligans broke into several, removed all the merchandise and carried it to the centre of the market place, where they destroyed it in a huge bonfire. Fire was set to a synagogue, but the flames did no damage.

News of the outrage reached Cracow only late yesterday afternoon. The district authorities immediately launched an investigation.

The Warsaw Jewish press, reporting these events to-day, charges that the pogrom band was composed of uniformed Endeks. It declares that seven Jewish shops were completely demolished and two lorries of Jewish merchandise destroyed.

The Palestine Situation

Mass Demonstration in London.

London, June 30th.

A MASS demonstration on the Palestine situation was held here last night under the auspices of the Zionist Federation of Great Britain and Ireland and the Central Keren Hayesod Committee. The demonstration was addressed by Rabbi Dr. Stephen S. Wise, Mr. Barnett Janner and Rev. J. K. Goldbloom, who was in the chair. MASS demonstration on the Palestine

Dr. Wise said that as an outside observer, he had noticed since 1920 a grievous discrepancy between Downing Street professions regarding Palestine. For years and years there had been a glaringly painful discrepancy between statements, promises and pledges made in Downing Street and Whitehall and the things done from day to day by the subordinate officials in Palestine. "The Balfour Declaration contains the word 'facilitation.' I am not maintaining that there has been no facilitation, but if we had had real facilitation all these years, we would not require protection now. We have had the minimum of the pledged facilitation. If I put the thing with my American crudeness, the minor officials in Palestine have looked upon Jews and treated them as invading exploiters instead of understanding that our Jews in Palestine are home-coming exiles and pilgrims."

"SOCIALISED DEMOCRACY" Reform Rabbis' Resolution

New York, June 26th.

THE Association of Reform Rabbis at its Jersey, to-day adopted a resolution de-nouncing Fascism and Communism, and supporting "socialised democracy." The convention petitioned the United States Government to grant to Jewish war objec-tors the same exemptions as are allowed to Onakers.

ACTIONS COMMITTEE TO MEET NEXT MONTH

London, June 28th.

THE Zionist Executive in London to-day notified all members of the Zionist General Council (Actions Committee) that a meeting of the committee will be convoked in August at a date and place to be announced later.

In the meantime, a one-day session of European members of the Council is contemplated for July 5th in Prague. The situation in Palestine will be fully discussed on that date.

THE UNOFFICIAL ARAB DELEGATION

Interview with Colonial Office Chief

London, June 23rd.

SIR JOHN MAFFEY, Permanent Under-Secretary for the Colonies, yesterday received the unofficial Arab delegation now in this country on a propaganda mission. The interview was at the request of the delegation delegation.

According to the "Daily Herald's" diplomatic correspondent, Sir John repeated to the delegation the sense of Colonial Secretary Ormsby-Gore's statement in Parliament last Friday. The Arabs replied by stating that the Arab general strike would continue until Jewish immigration is stonged.

Saratoga Springs, June 30th.

THE Annual Convention of the Independ-THE Annual Convention of the Independent ent Order Brith Abraham, at present meeting here, has passed a resolution to found a colony in Palestine which is to be known as Nachlath Iowa. They also adopted a resolution expressing their mourning for the deaths of Palestine pioneers and calling on England to restore order and facititate Jewish self-defence.

order and facititate Jewish self-defence.

Governor Herbert H. Lehman, who is a member of the Order, was given a great ovation when he addressed the Convention. He declared that Jewish faith taught fulfilment of one's obligations towards the community, and urged that the Jewish community should take a deep interest in Government affairs. He denied that the Jewish people were occupied only with materialism, paying a striking tribute to Jewish acts of idealism.
