PALESTINE EXCURSION

Arrangements for Third Boat

In addition to the usual ordinary and March boats, a special excursion has this year been arranged by the S.A. Zionist Federation. Passengers are granted exactly the same facilities as on the first two boats and given the regular excursion reductions. The name of the third excursion boat is the "Esperia," sailing from Capetown on the 1st of April next, and arriving in Genoa on the 16th. Passengers will be transferred to the "Esperia" which is to reach Palestine on the 1st of May. Special efforts are being made to ensure that passengers on the boat are given the opportunity of disembarking at the newly-opened Port in Tel-Aviv. Urgent representations have been made to the offices of the shipping company both here and abroad, and we hope to be in a position to make a definite announcement shortly.

Women's Services at Yeoville Synagogue

MR. ENGLSBERG'S TOUR

KEETMANSHOOP.

A SUCCESSFUL meeting was addressed by Mr. Engelsberg at the Hansa Hotel, in Keetmanshoop, under the auspices of the local Hebrew Congregation. Mr. S. Sirkin was in the chair. On the motion of Rev. Segal it was unanimously decided that the Congregation become affiliated to the Zionist Federation.

On Friday afternoon Mr. Engelsberg assisted Rev. Segal at the funeral service of the late Mrs. Fanny Horwitz. The large attendance included representatives of all sections of the population, and in addition to Rev. Segal and Mr. Engelsberg, Mr. S. L. Van Zyl, a church elder, also spoke in glowing terms of the deceased, who had had a hard struggle during her long widowhood to bring up a family of 10 children.

On Friday evening Mr. Engelsberg attended the school service, and on Saturday afternoon he addressed the Young Israel Club on the life of the Jewish Youth in Palestine. After the address he taught members several Hebrew songs, and told of his own life in a Kvatza.

During his stay in Keetmanshoop Mr. Engelsberg was the guest of Mr. and Mrs. Sirkin.

The congregation wishes to take this opportunity of expressing thanks to the Zionist Federation for the visit of Mr. Engelsberg to Keetmanshoop.

UPINGTON.

Mr. Engelsberg arrived in Upington on Sunday, 27th February, and addressed a meeting on the same evening under the auspices of the Gordonia Zionist Association. Rev. B. Wulf, Chairman of the Association, presided. Numerous questions followed Mr. Engelsberg's highly informative address. A hearty vote of thanks was proposed by Mr. H. Goldberg.

The address was followed by musical items rendered by the Misses J. Shulman and A. Nurich, Mrs. D. Blumberg and Mr. L. Caplan. Hebrew songs were enthusiastically sung by the whole community.

The following evening Mr. Engelsberg met the committee of the Zionist Association at the residence of Mrs. J. Kowen, and the future work of the society was then discussed. It was decided to organise a women's group within the framework of the society, and Mr. Engelsberg gave a number of useful suggestions in this connection.

On Tuesday evening Mr. Engelsberg addressed the pupils of the Hebrew school in Hebrew and also taught them a number of new Palestinian songs. Several parents were also present and an enjoyable evening was spent by all.
