MR. JABOTINSKY IN CAPETOWN

Mr. Jabotinsky addressed a public eeting at the Ahlambra Theatre, meeting at the Ahlambra Theatre, Capetown, on Sunday night, the 3rd April. In the course of his speech, which lasted for nearly three hours, he outlined the aims and objects of the Revisionist movement.

He stated that there were four points involved in the programme of the new Zionist movement. These were: No partition of Palestine; an international conference of all friendly Governments to discuss the problem of Jewish immigration into Palestine and the Jewish National Home; the Ten-Year Plan, which sought to secure a Jewish majority on both sides of the Jordan; and a world Jewish national assembly, to be elected through universal suffrage.
