

J.N.F. Campaign Concluded

Mr. Dunsky's Successful Tour

AN éminently successful Jewish National Fund Campaign has now been concluded. The final effort was made in a number of Western Province centres visited by Mr. Israel Dunsky, Organiser of the Jewish National Fund, who also carried out a number of engagements for the Propaganda and Youth Departments of the Federation. Mr. Dunsky everywhere met with an extremely cordial reception.

In those centres where the J.N.F. Campaign was launched, the results surpassed all expectations, in some cases being doubled, and even trebled. At the outset thanks are due to the communities concerned for their generous response, which showed a deep understanding of the urgency of land purchase and a readiness to participate in this most sacred of Jewish tasks, Geulath Haaretz.
