# Brilliant Symphony Concert

Music-lovers had every reason to enjoy the programme presented at the second concert of the season given by the Johannesburg Symphony Society in the City Hall on Wednesday night. Under the baton of Mr. Joseph Trauneck, the orchestra distinguished itself by some brilliant renderings, while Mr. Leopold Premyslav, as soloist, gave a notable performance of Wieniawski's Violin Concerto in D Minor. Undeterred by the complexities of this interesting work—one of the most difficult concertos ever written—Mr. Premyslav played with astonishing ease and dexterity, extracting a beautiful, singing tone from his violin, and revealing much judgment and a considerable interpretative gift.

The chief event of the evening was Brahms's Fourth Symphony. Despite some unevenness and faltering immediately after the opening passages, the orchestra on the whole acquitted itself very creditably, never obscuring the clear and beautiful design of the symphonic structure by overemphasis on details.

The South African composer chosen for inclusion in this programme was Mr. Colin Taylor. His Prelude and Sarabande for Strings was handled, as this graceful little work demands, with charm and delicacy.

The concert opened with Gold-marks' "Sakuntala" Overture.
