DR. A. BIRNBAUM

Appointed Director of Jewish Education in the Cape

IT is announced by the Cape Board of Jewish Education that Dr. A. Birnbaum, of Johannesburg, has accepted a call to occupy the post of Director of Jewish Education in the Cape.



Dr. Birnbaum is well-known in the Jewish education world in South Africa. He came here some years ago, bringing with him a fine reputation from Austria where he had studied and taught.

Previous to coming to South Africa, Dr. Birnbaum spent a number of years in Palestine. He became a student at the Mizrahi Teachers' Seminary and qualified there under the guidance of Professor David Yellin. Some time later he occupied the post of lecturer on Bible and Hebrew Literature at the Hebrew Pedagogium of Vienna. He obtained the degree of Doctor of Philosophy at the University of Vienna in 1925.
