BALFOUR DAY

REPORTS continue to pour in to the Head Office of the Jewish National Fund from all centres to the effect that a country-wide house-to-house collection will be held on November 6th in connection with Balfour Day. In Johannesburg particularly, workers of the Women's Zionist League, the Women's Mizrachi Organisation and the Transvaal Zionist Youth Organisation have organised themselves to make a determined effort on November 6th. They confidently anticipate a noteworthy reception from the public.

AN EXCELLENT STEP

ON Tuesday, 1st November, a meeting took place at the residence of Mrs. A. L. Kaplan, of Kenilworth, Johannesburg. Mrs. K. Gluckmann, chairman of the National Fund committee for South Africa, and Mr. A. Abrahamson, Organiser of the Committee, were present to meet committee members of the Southern Suburbs Women's Zionist League and the Women's Mizrachi Organisation of the district.

The meeting was an auspicious one, because it inaugurated a joint committee for J.N.F. Box work in the Southern Suburbs. Mrs. P. Sack was unanimously appointed Secretary, and all National Fund box work will now be carried out by this committee under the joint chairmanship of Mrs. Kaplan and Mrs. Gingold. The committee's first task will be a joint organisation for the Balfour Day collection, after which they have set themselves the aim of placing a National Fund box in every Jewish house in the Southern Suburbs.

A similar meeting will shortly take place to inaugurate joint activity in Orange Grove. The Women's Mizrachi Organisation will be solely responsible for box work in Fordsburg and Braamfontein. The Johannesburg Women's Zionist League has cordially welcomed these new forces in the task of Geulath Haaretz.

A FINE GIFT

THE J.N.F. Office for South
Africa has on many occasions
stressed the need for greater
financial resources to be placed at
the disposal of the Jewish National
Fund in Jerusalem. Ample reference has been made both in these
columns and in circulars which the
office issues to the various societies. The effect has been good and
many societies have increased their
efforts for the J.N.F. in various
directions. But it is gratifying to
be able to report that a number
of individuals have also made
special efforts.

The most outstanding example in the latter connection is the fine gift which was recently given to the National Fund by the well-known Zionists of Escombe, Mr. and Mrs. M. Morrison.

Realising the necessity for additional land purchase, Mr. and Mrs. Morrison gave £500 to the Jewish National Fund. Interest on this sum, £25 per annum, is to be paid over to the Hebrew University for a period of 20 years and is to be presented annually as a bursary to be known as "The Moses and May Morrison Bursary." Zionists everywhere will applaud this truly splendid gesture.

THE KEREN HAYESOD IN GERMANY

Increasing Support Despite Decreasing Population

INTERESTING statistics are available of the increasing support extended by German Jewry to the Keren Hayesod. Although the German Jewish population has decreased considerably, the number of contributors to the Keren Hayesod has grown from 4,364 in 1933 to over 7,000 in 1938.

Despite the impoverishment of German Jewry, the amount raised by the Keren Hayesod during the past year was more than double that attained in 1933.

Interesting also is the fact that more than 150 Hebrew Congregations now make regularly annual contributions from their funds to the Keren Hayesod.

Zionist educational work has also been intensified and many Zionist groups make an intensive study of all phases of Palestinian development.
