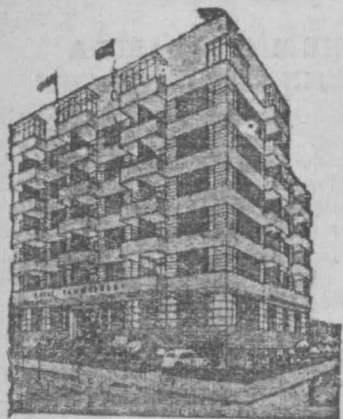

The "Eroica" was indeed a trying test for the orchestra, but they acquitted themselves ably in all four movements, notably the first.

Mr. Colin Taylor's composition was well received, as also were the Mozart and Smetana works.
