Summary

THE power of initiative and the vitality of Jewish en-terprise in Palestine has survived the long ordeal of the last three years. The expansion of and undertakings, existing penetration into new branches of economic life have continued unimpeded. New ventures have been embarked upon and new conquests achieved, and these have acted as stimuli to the will and resolve of the Jewish people not to slacken in the work of reconstruction and upbuilding in spite of the severe difficulties of these years.

The outstanding achievements may be summarised as follows:

- (1) 50,000 Jewish immigrants, of which at least 45,000 have been economically absorbed.
- (2) The establishment of 30 settle-
- (3) Increased agricultural production and sales.
- (4) The construction of Tel-Aviv port, and the growing maritime activity.
- (5) The creation of new industries increasing industrial the export.
- (6) The construction of new roads.
- The maintenance of general economic activity on a level not far below the peak level of 1935.

SOUND ECONOMIC POSITION PRETORIA JEWISH WOMEN'S BENEVOLENT SOCIETY

THE Pretoria Jewish Women's Benevolent Society has for the Benevolent Society has for the last fifteen years done a great deal for the unfortunate patients at the Pretoria Mental Hospital. The last Sunday afternoon of every month is devoted to giving the Jewish patients a treat. There are between forty and fifty Jewish patients, and the cost of these treats is therefore considerable. Sometimes the treats are donated by individual businessmen, but in five out of six cases the cost is horne by the Society's own funds.

Visits are also paid to the Institu-tion, and kosher food is often brought to the patients.

But there is not more than one out of ten patients who actually has relatives in Pretoria who subscribe to the cost of these monthly treats. Most of them come from other parts of the country, mainly Johannesburg, which contributes nothing towards the expenses. The Society therefore appeals to the Jewish people of Johannesburg to subscribe to the fund. Five guineas will give all the patients a splendid treat.
