RUBINSTEIN TO PLAY ON SUNDAY EVENING

Arthur Rubinstein, the famous pianist, will give his first South African concert in Cape Town this evening at the Alhambra Theatre, and is due to give his first Johannesburg recital at the Colosseum Theatre on Sunday evening, 28th inst.

The eminent pianist is likely to draw large audiences of music-lovers during his short stay in South Africa. He has come here with a reputation of being one of the greatest of living pianists; his interpretations of the great masters are superb performances. Rubinstein also interprets many of the modern composers and his programme will be illuminating and of interest to all sections of lovers of piano music.

The second concert will be at the Empire Theatre on Thursday, June 1, and the third, and last, will be at the Colosseum on Sunday, June 4. Reservations for the Colosseum performances must be made at the Colosseum booking office, and for the Empire at Public booking office (Carlton Hotel branch).

MAYOR OF JOHANNESBURG ENTERTAINED

Luncheon by Jewish Guild

On Monday last the Mayor of Johannesburg, Councillor J. J. Page, and Mrs. Page were guests of honour at a luncheon held at the Jewish Guild.

Mr. W. Wolpert (Chairman of institution) presided, and welcomed among the guests Mr. T. A. M. Middle, the Deputy Mayor, Mr. I. M. the Town Clerk, and Mrs. Marks. Mr. Wolpert paid a tribute to the sense of citizenship shown by Mr. Page.

The Mayor expressed his appreciation of the honour paid to Mrs. Page and himself by the Jewish Guild having them as guests.

He then delivered an interesting address upon the revenue expenditure of Johannesburg, which now reaches over £5,000,000 per annum. He declared that in so large a concern was a simple matter for things to go wrong and advised his audience to careful whom they sent to the Council to represent them. He felt that more business men were needed in the Council.

"Unless you put men into office who are prepared to uphold the highest principles of democracy you cannot achieve anything," he said. "The individual units in the community have it in their power to bring about."

Mr. H. Carter proposed a vote of thanks to the Mayor, and congratulated the city upon having such a fine public-spirited gentleman as its chief citizen.
