Offers £1,000 for Naval Bursaries

A sum of £1,000 to enable four young South Africans to be trained in the Royal Navy as officers—two as executive officers and two as engineer officers—has been offered by Mr. Max Sonnenberg, M.P. for the South Peninsula.

This announcement was made by the Capetown branch of the Navy League, to whom the offer of the four bursaries was made. The Navy League has gratefully accepted the offer.

The amount of each bursary, £200 for passage to England, is based on an Admiralty circular issued in July, 1937, concerning expenses to be incurred by naval cadets and midshipmen during their training. The amount of £200 is considerably in excess of the Admiralty's estimate of normal expenses during training.
