THE Louis Landau Bursaries of £30 each for the purpose of assisting students in continuing their Hebrew studies at the Witwatersrand University, have now been awarded by the Council of the United Hebrew Schools of Johannesburg.

The recipients, Mr. Ronald Sobel and Miss Hadassa Rosenberg, are students at the Yeoville Hebrew School, and gained distinctions in Hebrew in the recent matriculation examination.

Mr. Sobel, who is taking an art course at the Witwatersrand University, intends to study for the Jewish Ministry. Miss Rosenberg, who is taking a Kindergarten course at the local Technical College, will devote her career to Hebrew Kindergarten work.

It is further announced that Miss Zelda Jacobson (of the Yeoville Hebrew School), Mr. Ronald Sobel and Mr. Solomon Kaplan (of the La Rochelle Hebrew School), will benefit by the Victor Kark Scholarships.
