J.N.F. Campaign Proceeding Apace

Outstanding Results to Date

A Cable From Jerusalem

WORK in connection with the Jewish National Fund campaign is proceeding apace and no effort is being spared to make this one of the most successful efforts for the Keren Kayemeth yet held in South Africa. The results to date have been outstanding and there is every prospect that the high level of contributions so far achieved will be maintained.

THE vital necessity for the campaign at the present time is yet further emphasised in a cable received from J.N.F. headquarters in Jerusalem this week, which states that 6,400 agricultural labourers who are qualified candidates for settlement, are awaiting their turn for land. Their full settlement calls for about 160,000 dunams, and the Keren Kayemeth's total reserve is 37,000 dunams, of which a substantial portion requires amelioration to render it fit for immediate settlement. This year's drop in the Keren Kayemeth receipts is restricting the activity of the Fund despite the favourable conditions for buying land.

SUCCESSFUL WORKERS' MEETING

On Tuesday night a highly successful meeting of workers in the campaign was held at the Coronation Hall. Mr. H. L. Karnovsky, Chairman of the Johannesburg Campaign Committee, who presided, stressed the need for unremitting effort for the Fund, and Mr. Harry Levin gave an interesting address in which he emphasised the urgent need for land purchase in Palestine to-day. After a brief address by Mr. B. Gering, the meeting entered into a

thorough discussion of ways and means of conducting the canvass throughout the city.

DR. ALEXANDER GOLDSTEIN

The delay in the arrival of Dr. Alexander Goldstein, to the deep regret of all concerned, has necessitated the postponement of a number of campaign functions which were to have been held during the past week, but it is hoped that these will take place in the near future. Dr. Goldstein is expected here very shortly and will start immediately on the arduous tasks before him.

Germiston's Splendid Start

Campaign Inaugurated This Week

A splendid start to the campaign at Germiston was made on Tuesday night last when, at a function held at the residence of Mr. and Mrs. S. Kalmek; the very representative gathering present—which included leading members of the Germiston community—contributed double the amount raised at the corresponding function held during the last campaign.

Mr. B. Liebman, Chairman of the Germiston Campaign Committee, presided, and a stirring address was delivered by Mr. N. Kirschner, Chairman of the S.A. Zionist Federation. A vote of thanks to the speaker was proposed by Rev. Dr. Lichtigfeld and seconded by Mr. Israel Dunsky, Chairman of the Germiston Zionist Society, who paid special tribute to Mr. and Mrs. Kalmek for their hospitality, and to Mr. Liebman, for presiding.

A thorough canvass is proceeding at Germiston, and it is anticipated that the final results will by far exceed any previous contributions made in Germiston to the Jewish National Fund.
