**EDUCATIONAL TOUR BY RABBI ZLOTNIK**

*We publish below a further report of Rabbi J. L. Zlotnik's recent educational tour of the Eastern Province. A report of his visits to certain centres was printed last week.*

**PORT ELIZABETH.**

From East London Rabbi Zlotnik proceeded to Port Elizabeth. On Saturday he attended the services of the Hebrew School Congregation conducted by the pupils of the school, and expressed his satisfaction with the admirable way the services are being conducted.

On Sunday morning, 31st August, Rabbi Zlotnik visited the Uitenhage community, accompanied by Mr. L. Dubb, Chairman of the Hebrew School in Port Elizabeth. In addition to inspecting the school here, he also conferred with the School Committee.

On Sunday evening Rabbi Zlotnik addressed a large gathering at the Emmanuel Hall, Port Elizabeth, on "The Problems of Hebrew Education" in the English-speaking countries. Mr. L. Dubb was in the chair. On Tuesday evening he delivered a lecture to the Study Group which is under the leadership of Mr. I. Goss.

After inspecting the Port Elizabeth Hebrew School and examining the pupils, Rabbi Zlotnik met the School Committee and discussed various problems of education.

**Rabbi Zlotnik Visits Witbank**

On Sunday, 29th September, Rabbi J. L. Zlotnik visited the Jewish community in Witbank. He examined the Hebrew School in the morning and later lunched with Mr. and Mrs. C. H.
