The Late Mr. M. Pevsner's Will
Large Bequests to Jewish and Non-Jewish Causes

LARGE bequests to Zionist and charitable organisations are made in the will of the late Mr. Michael Pevsner, who died in Capetown on Friday, 17th instant. He was 65. The late Mr. Pevsner, who was a well-known personality in the Mother City, arrived in this country from Russia in 1897, and became a prominent tobacco grower and merchant. He was interested in communal institutions and the Zionist movement, and he made financial contributions to both.

In accordance with Mr. Pevsner's will, the Hebrew University of Jerusalem will receive £1,000.

Legacies of £1,000 each are also bequeathed to the Cape Jewish Aged Home, the Cape Jewish Orphanage and the Jewish Board of Guardians, Capetown.

One thousand two hundred and fifty pounds is left to the Groote Schuur Hospital, on condition that £250 of the amount is devoted to the establishment, or better equipping, of a Kosher kitchen to pay special regard to the Jewish methods of preparing and serving food.

A sum of £500 is left to the Talmud Torah Schools of Capetown.

MUSICAL SOCIETY'S CONCERT
Outstanding Recital by Isidor Epstein and Betty Pack

TWO outstanding artists, Isidor Epstein (piano) and Betty Pack ('cello), combined to present an unusual and interesting programme of music at the concert held by the Musical Society in the Duncan Hall on Wednesday night of last week. The opening work, a Sonata in D Minor for piano and 'cello by Andrea Caporale, is an 18th century composition of considerable charm, and both pianist and 'cellist gave an admirable performance, faithful to the spirit of the period in which this little-known work was composed.

A Sonata in B Flat Minor by Dohnanji, and the Saint-Saens Sonata, Opus 32, were also presented by Mr. Epstein and Miss Pack, and in each performance the artists showed complete understanding of and sympathy with the intention of the composer. The turbulence and dramatic passages of the Saint-Saens were given due emphasis without any over exuberance, and the good ensemble work in the rendering of both these sonatas was one of the notable features of the evening.

To both the Mayor of Capetown and Rev. I. Abrahams, of the Gardens Synagogue, £1,000 is to be given for allocation, in consultation with the executors of the estate, to such public charity or charities in Capetown as they and the executors may consider appropriate.

Similar amounts under similar conditions are to be allocated by the Mayors of Bulawayo and Salisbury to public charities in their areas, provided due regard is had to Mr. Pevsner's wish that one-half be allocated to charities of a Jewish character, the other half to those of a non-Jewish character.

One thousand pounds is bequeathed to any seaside home, in or around Muizenberg, which in the opinion of the executors can be regarded as established for the benefit of Rhodesian children.

The executors are to pay £500 to any organisation for the benefit of members of the non-European community in Capetown as they may select. A similar amount under similar conditions is to be for the benefit of the native community.

Sums of £250 are to go to each of the following institutions: Nazareth House in Capetown, the Princess Alice Home of Recovery at Retreat and the Lady Michaelis Orthopaedic Home at Plumstead.

A final public bequest is one of £2,500 to be set aside as a fund from which the interest will be devoted to providing patients in necessitous circumstances on leaving any hospital, convalescent home or nursing home in the Cape Division with essential articles of clothing.

In all, £15,000 is left in the will for public bequests.
