

Around the Cinemas

"East of the River" at Plaza

John Garfield is starred as the tough guy who wants to live without working in "East of the River," the present attraction at the Plaza. This story of New York's tough neighbourhood also features such prominent players as Brenda Marsnall, Marjorie Rambeau, William Lundigan and George Tobias. The drama revolves around Garfield, the East Side tough, and his foster brother, an aesthetic boy in spite of his environment, and Ma Raviola, whose strong hand straightens out the complications that arise in their lives. The romantic interest is supplied by Brenda Marshall. The plot is unusual, with a completely unexpected ending, and should certainly hold the interest of cinema-goers.
