OBITUARY

MR. D. I. FRAM

The death occurred in a Johannesburg nursing home, on Thursday, 13th August, at the age of 70, of Mr. Daniel Isaac Fram, founder of Messrs. D. I. Fram and Co., Ltd., canvas manufacturers and tent makers, and a pioneer of the weaving and allied industry in South Africa.

The late Mr. Fram came to South Africa from Lithuania in 1895, About eight years ago he retired from his business which has since been run by his sons. He is survived by a wife, four sons and three daughters.

In the passing of Mr. Fram the orthodox Jewish community of the Rand has lost one of its most prominent leaders. Mr. Fram was associated throughout his life in South Africa with congregational activity, and was for a number of years the Senior Warden of the Yeoville Synagogue.

MR. LIONEL I. ISRAEL

The community of Ficksburg suffered a severe loss recently in the death of Mr. Lionel I. Israel. On the morning of the funeral, which was largely attended, all Jewish places of business in Ficksburg were closed. Rev. I. Chonowitz intoned the prayers at the graveside.

The deceased was a popular citizen of the district and held in the highest esteem. He was most generous in his charitable donations and also supported all forms of war effort. The eldest son of the deceased, Bobby, was one of the first in Ficksburg to join the Forces and was taken prisoner at the battle of Sidi Rezegh.

MR. MAURICE WOLK

The Jewish community of Krugers-dorp was plunged into deep grief byy the sudden passing away, on the bih inst., of Mr. Maurice C. Wolk, elder son of Rev. and Mrs. Louis Wolk. He died at the early age of thirty-eight.

The late Mr. Wolk was a man of outstanding intellectual gifts and many attainments. At the age of sixteen he was awarded a scholarship at Rhodes University, where he studied for some time. Later he proceeded to the University of Capetown to study medicine, and then went overseas to complete his course. Severe illness, however, compelled him to interrupt his medical studies. He returned to South Africa in 1924 and subsequently took up the profession of Law.

The late Mr. Wolk was also an able journalist and for some time contributed articles to the "Cape Argus" and "Cape Times." For a short period he was a member of the Editorial Staff of the latter news-

Mr. Wolk started his legal practice in Port Elizabeth, but in 1934 settled in Krugersdorp, where he earned for himself a high reputation as a man of integrity and of great ability. ability.

He was active in communal work and for some time was a member of the Council of the United Hebrew In-stitutions of Krugersdorp and of the local Hebrew School Committee.

In 1936 the late Mr. Wolk married Miss Rhona Levson, only child of Mr. and Mrs. Leon Levson, of Johannes-burg. He leaves a son, Jonathan David, eighteen months old.
