

EXTRACT OF SPEECH BY DR. F. VAN ZYL SLABBERT, M.P., TO
STUDENTS AT THE CAMPUS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF NATAL, DURBAN

11 APRIL, 1984

It is good to keep alive a positive climate for reform which can be exploited to bring about real change. It is dangerous, however, for whites in particular, to live in a false sense of euphoria, simply because of the Nkomati Accord and the results of the referendum.

The Nkomati Accord stabilized relationships between Mozambique and South Africa. It did not bring about reform between black and white inside South Africa. It does however make it possible to divert time, energy and resources to finding new solutions to old problems in our domestic situation. However, the signs for such new solutions are not forthcoming. We must not forget that this Government's policy toward fellow black South Africans is premised on the assumption that :

- (a) They are not South African citizens;
- (b) therefore cannot be part of a common South African Constitution;
- (c) their migration to the cities to look for work must be subject to influx control which breaks up family life and treats them as foreigners in the land of their birth;
