Cape Jewish Orphanage.

The whole Committee carried out a meticulous examination of every department of the buildings and grounds and in addition to the Committee the Rev. I. Levine and Mrs. Levine of the Sea Point Community and Mrs. S. Fryde, Mrs. J. Kadish and several other Orphanage wellwishers were also present.

After the inspection, afternoon tea was tastefully served by Mrs. Beresinsky, the Matron when the President, Mr. J. M. Weinreich took the opportunity of welcoming the visitors and congratulating Mrs. Fryde on her seventieth birthday. He felt sure that all present must realize that apart from the crowded dormitory accommodation the building lacked many up-to-date necessities of a Home for the children. He hoped that in the near future the Committee would be able to formulate a scheme for remedying the present unsatisfactory conditions.

Maitland Hebrew School.

On the 23rd June a Hebrew play entitled "Bat Jephtach," was presented by the children of the above school.

The play consisted of four acts, the theme being a Biblical episode. The different characters were so well portrayed that it proved without doubt, that the children were imbued with the spiritual understanding of that historic background. Their interpretation of the happy and sad events relative to that period, also their skilful characterisation, was deeply appreciated by a very large and representative audience, for whom the atmosphere and environment of the Jew of that ancient Biblical epoch was revived and depicted in its natural and beautiful setting. The appropriate costumes, the dances, music, songs and a lively Eastern market, full of atmosphere and colour peculiar to the East on the whole, and to ancient Jewry in particular helped to resuscitate that remote period. Furthermore, the easy and fluent use of the Hebrew language as a medium of the play, afforded the participants wider scope for the correct expression and interpretation of the theme.

This was the first time that a full length play in Hebrew was undertaken by the school and presented by children, and it proved very successful; it is hoped that the precedent will be followed by other schools for the great educational and cultural value of such a production cannot be overestimated.

Mr. H. Lederman, principal of the school, and his assistant Mr. Flaxman are to be congratulated on the production of the play.

The invaluable assistance rendered by Mr. Kaufman, as Chairman of the Cultural Sub-Committee of the Maitland Hebrew Congregation is deeply appreciated.

Amongst those present were Dr. C. Resnekov, Cha'rman of the Board of Hebrew Education, Rabbi M. Morgenstern, Dr. B. Rabinowitz, Inspector of Hebrew Schools, Mr. B. Chideckel, Mr. Z.
