Socialism desired state and religion to be divorced but regarded religion only as a private matter for each individual.

The discussion was of an unusually high standard and showed that the majority of the audience were definitely not sympathetic to Socialist principles.

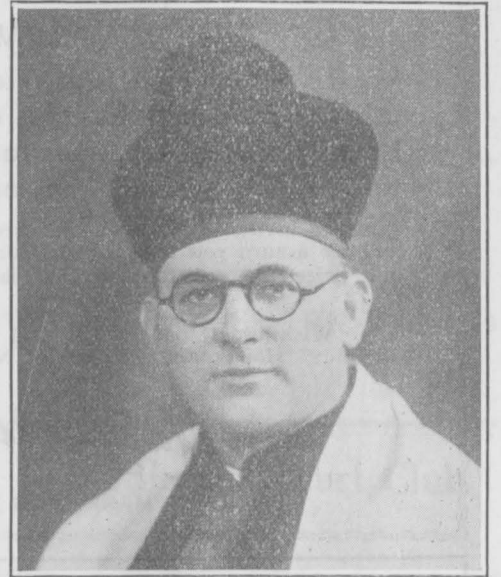
Miss Hannah Oblowitz and Mr. Harry Rabinowitz contributed a recitation and a piano solo respectively.
