CAPE ZIONIST YOUTH EXECUTIVE.

Last week-end saw two outstanding gatherings which incidentally marked the temporary suspension of activities until after the season.

The first was an Oneg Shabbat held at Rosecourt on Friday evening, December 8th. Miss H. Keyser, who organised the affair on behalf of the Executive, presided, and there was a very large attendance. The main feature of the evening was a Symposium on Chanukah. Mr. E. Kluk spoke on the History of the Festival, Miss H. Hodes on its celebration throughout the ages, and Mr. V. Resnekov on Chanukah in Eretz Israel. An interesting commentary on the week's Haftorah was given by Mr. L. Sandler. The serving of refreshments and the animated singing of Hebrew songs brought the evening to a close.

The second function was the annual Social given in honour of the Jewish Matriculants. This took place at the Zionist Hall on Saturday evening, 9th inst. Mr. D. Meyerowitz presided and welcomed the guests. Mr. E. Charloff showed some interesting film slides on Palestine, and an address on the importance of Zionism and the task of young Jews was given by Mr. S. M. Levin. The evening concluded with dancing. It is hoped that as a result of this gathering several new recruits for the Zionist movement have been obtained.

A special Council meeting of societies will be held during the vacation. It is to take place at the Strand camp on Sunday, January 7th, at 10.30 a.m. Societies should make a point of being represented. It is hoped that prominent Zionist Youth leaders from the North will participate.
