### MASSADAH ASSOCIATION.

The Massadah Zionist Parliamentary Debating Circle will be officially opened at the Minor Zionist Hall on Tuesday, Jan. 23rd, at 8 p.m. The *Parliament* will be convened by Mr. Morris Alexander, K.C., M.P., who as President of the Circle and "Governor-General" of the "House" will read the "Speech from the Throne." Mr. Alexander will then deliver an address on "The History of Parliamentary Institutions." This will be followed by a general debate on the "Speech from the Throne."
