took tours twice a year to make their research of more value. As a result of their research his scholars wrote theses and articles which showed how successful they had been in their work. His success was due to his personal contact with his students, and every month he arranged gatherings at his home where he and his students discussed their individual work.

In addition to his work at the University he interested himself in all the scientific societies, and took an active part in every branch of Jewish life in the country. He delivered public lectures at different places on behalf of the University. He also lectured on behalf of the "Society for Research in the History of Eretz-Israel," being chairman of the society during the last few years of his life.

Prof. Klein encouraged his pupils to undertake research. Both in his daily contacts and his spiritual work he showed the same energy. He was very sensitive when he heard anything detrimental to the Jewish nation, and remained to the end a defender of everything Jewish. His students and the whole country mourn his loss and revere his memory.
