Vladimir Jabotinsky.

The Editor, S.A. Jewish Chronicle.

Sir,—Your readers must be grateful to Mr. Rubik for his ideas and reflections on Mr. Jabotinsky. They are worth quite a number of the so-called "evaluations." Mr. Rubik must be one of the very few in this country who has first-hand experience of the creative power of Jabotinsky in his early days.

Even in the recreated Bialik of his Russian translation the spell can be felt. "Ideas and Reflections" give one furiously to think. As one who in the first onslaught of Revisionism in this country sought to get his bearings towards the phenomenon on more basic lines than party lines, I remember saying in argument that Jabotinsky may have the future on his side because his ideas seem of a piece with the new totalitarian tendencies, and because of his early vision that military force would play the dominant role in the 20th as idealistic belief in progress played in the 19th century. What Mr. Rubik says about Jabotinsky's respect for Samson and his contempt for the Galuth Jew seems to throw light on this notion. Is it the old story of the Jewish idea of swords into ploughshares versus "guns before butter" of the present era? The old civilisation and the old Zionism in the balance for the same reasons?

Would Mr. Rubik please write again from this angle—in elucidation or contempt. I have a heart for any fate.—Yours, etc.,
