Union of Jewish Women.

ANNUAL REPORT.

The Ninth Annual Report of the Union of Jewish Women (Cape Town Branch) which has just been issued reveals that the Association is intensifying its excellent work in many directions. Its activities are vared and manifold and reflect great credit on the Committee.

The Union has participated in general activities such as "Our Children's Day," Grape Day, Fairhaven Street Market and various collections. It has established a Milk Depot and Soup Kitchen at Windermere in order to alleviate distress in the district and has participated in the relief work of the Flood Relief Committee.

War Activities.

Its war activities are increasing daily. The majority of members have joined the S.A.W.A.S.; there are nineteen work parties who are sending in their work to the Auxiliary, Palestine, etc., in the name of the Union.

The Union is responsible for the running of the Soldiers' Club for two and sometimes three days a month. The arrangements are in the hands of Mrs. Benson and Mrs. Blumberg assisted by a sub-committee and these have been most successful. On various occasions when there has been a convoy in part the Union has run a canteen at the Zionist Hall; large numbers of men have been entertained and dances and outings have been arranged for them.

The Branch has dispatched about thirty cases of clothing to the Union of Jewish Women in London for relief in bombed areas and these have been gratefully acknowledged.

Meetings.

Monthly meetings have been held during the year and have been addressed by speakers on a variety of topics.

The membership has increased to 518, but, says the Report, "there is still much room for expansion and it is not until every Jewish woman feels that it is her duty to become a member of the Union that it can become a force in the community. Members are urged to develop a sense of loyalty to the Union by fully co-operating in all the varied activities.

The exhibitions entitle the girls to compete again next year for the overseas scholarship.

Rev. M. J. Cohen, of Muizemerg, who has been in the private block at Groote Schuur Hospital for the past fortnight for observation and treatment, is progressing favourably.

Worcester Jewish Ladies' Society.

A very successful function was held in the Zionist Hall on October 1st in aid of War Funds. A musical play, "Red Riding Hood," produced by Mrs. Naomi Sagor, was most charmingly staged, the costumes and scenery being in the able hands of Mr. and Mrs. Schwarzer.
