## Successful Gathering at Picketberg.

A well-attended meeting was held on Sunday, 9th inst., at 8.15 p.m., at the Commercial Hotel, Picketberg. The gathering was called at the instance of the W.P. Propaganda Council, with the co-operation of Mrs. A. Shapiro, of Picketberg, and Mr. L. Katz, of Moorreesburg. Amongst the audience of over fifty persons were visitors from Porterville, Moorreesburg and Hoffman's Hof.

The first speaker was Mr. M. Katovsky, a member of the Propoganda Council, who referred to the twenty-fourth anniversary of the Balfour Declaration and ably traced its origins and history. He dwelt on subsequent political developments in Palestine and the attitude of the Mandatory Power. He was followed by Rev. Ch. Gordon, of Wynberg, who delivered an eloquent and inspiring address on Eretz Israel and the part it occupied in Jewish hopes and aspiration. He paid a glowing tribute to the memory of the late Mr. M. Ussishkin.

During the evening items were given by Miss L. Katzeff and Mr. R. Isaacson. Hebrew and Yiddish songs were rendered by a choir. An American auction was conducted in aid of the Wizo Wool Fund.

Rev. Rachman proposed a hearty vote of thanks to the speakers, and the artists were thanked by Mr. Weinreich. Mr. L. Katz voiced the appreciation of the visitors.

Earlier in the day Mr. Katovsky, who is also a member of the Cape Zionist Youth Executive, met the younger members of the community at the residence of Mrs. Klein. An interesting afternoon was spent and a youth group established with Miss L. Katzeff as chairlady.
