MEMORIAL MEETING.

A Memorial Meeting to the late Michael Haskel was held at the Zionist Hall on Sunday night under the auspices of the New Zionist Organisation.

Mr. J. Talberg was in the chair and spoke of the grievious loss sustained by the Zionist Movement in South Africa through Mr. Haskel's death. It was some consolation that he lived to see unity attained in local Zionism and it was to be hoped that this unity for which he had striven so hard would be permanent.

Mr. J. BLUMENTHAL said that Mr. Haskel had devoted all his means and energy to the furtherance of the cause of the Jewish people. He had worked unflinchingly for the ideal of a Jewish State in Palestine and there could be no better tribute to his memory than to carry on his work.

Mr. J. PINCUS said it would be very difficult to fill the gap left by the death of Mr. Haskel. He was a unique personality and was outstanding for his generosity. It was inevitable that he should be a Zionist and that the Zionism he embraced should be that of Herzl, Nordau and Jabotinsky. Behind his apparent simplicity lay a wealth of true wisdom, of courage and fearlessness on questions he considered fundamental. He would always have an honoured place in the memories of his co-workers.

Mr. J. WEINREICH, on behalf of the Dorshei Zion Association, spoke of Mr. Haskel as an ardent Zionist and intimate friend whom he had known for many years. It was ironic that he should have died just when unity was in sight, for it was his greatest desire in life. He was very generous and had in the past made large contributions to the National Funds.

Mr. R. KOTLOWITZ said that Mr. Haskel had displayed the greatest energy and activity in his Zionist work. When he was convinced of the fundamental principles of Revisionism he joined the N.Z.O. and from 1933 became its principal supporter in South Africa.

Mr. E. BEN-HORIN said that Mr. Haskel was devoted heart and soul to the Zionist ideal. His material contributions to the cause were enormous and out of all proportion to his means. He was a man of strong mind and proud spirit and had an inborn political instinct. He was uncompromising in his principles and nothing could divert him from the course he believed to be right. His death was a great loss to the whole Zionist Movement.

Cantor M. Katzin intoned the Hazkarah.

Concluding Holiday Function at Muizenberg.

The final gathering in the series of public meetings arranged at Muizenberg for the holiday season was held at the Talmud Torah Hall on Thursday, 5th inst., at 8.15 p.m. Mr. J. M. Weinreich, Chairman of the W.P. Propaganda Council, presided.

The speaker of the evening was Mr. B. L. Rubik, who delivered an address entitled "Revaluation of Values." He pointed out the need for a realistic approach to the problems of to-day and for the necessity of taking a broader outlook on Zionism which was certainly not confined to the political arena. It was necessary to preserve the positive values of Diaspora life. Mr. Rubik stressed the importance of a courageous programme for post-war reconstruction.

Mr. Weinreich took advantage of the opportunity to express his Council's sincerest appreciation for Mr. Rubik's splendid efforts in connection with the organising of the holiday functions. This had involved an enormous amount of work and Mr. Rubik had worked tirelessly in order to ensure the great success of the undertaking. Mr. Rubik, in a brief acknowledgment, exressed thanks to Mrs. Jocum and her assistants for bearing the responsibility of providing refreshments at each meeting and also paid a tribute to the Chairman and Secretary of the Council for their efforts.

During the evening songs were rendered by Mr. Harry Rabinowitz, recitations by Mr. M. Asher, and a humorous monologue by Mr. G. Laden.
